Parkinson's is a progressive neurological condition. The major symptoms are tremor, slowness of movement, muscle rigidity and postural instability.

There are great difference between people with Parkinson's in terms of their first symptoms, the order in which the symptoms appear and the progression and severity of the symptoms. Through research it is hoped to widen the range of treatment and therapy options for people living with Parkinson's at the present time, as well as contribute to the current body of knowledge.

Knowledge shared can lead to improved management of the symptoms and enhance the quality of life for many people living with this long-term condition.

Advances in knowledge may ultimately influence the direction of future research and may one day unlock the mystery of prevention and cure.

- Applications will be for one year (renewal may be considered).
- The research must be related to Parkinson's.
- Ethical approval must be obtained.
